
The open hours for adoration are:



December: The Seven Sorrows of Mary – Jesus is Taken Down from the Cross Reflection by Monique Sammut

"What a sea of tears & sorrows / Did the soul of Mary toss / To & fro upon its billows / While she wept her bitter loss; / In her arms her Jesus holding; / Torn so newly from the Cross. / Oh, that mournful Virgin Mother, / See her tears how fast they flow / Down upon His mangled Body, / Wounded Side, & thorny Brow; / While His Hands & Feet she kisses, / Picture of immortal woe. / Gentle Mother, we beseech thee, / By thy tears & troubles sore; / By the death of thy dear Offspring, / By the bloody wounds He bore: / Touch our hearts with that true sorrow, / Which afflicted thee of yore." ~ What a Sea of Tears and Sorrows by Charles Gounod

Several years ago, a friend & I were having a conversation about life. I don't remember half of what we talked about, but one thing he said came back to me as I was thinking about this sixth sorrow & picturing Michelangelo's Pietà: "We can't love people with closed hands – tight fists grasping & hanging on. We have to love others with open hands – willing to let them go." In the Pietà, one of Mary's hands is holding Jesus, while the other is open, palm facing upwards in a gesture of surrender & openness.

Grasping comes so naturally. I think we all, in some way, grasp for control of our circumstances, our relationships, & many other aspects of our lives. We let "Jesus take the wheel," but before long, we become back seat drivers. We take the good things God has given us & make the gifts more important than the Giver. There's a quote by Barb Raveling that says, "One of the ways we love Him well is to hold His gifts with open hands, willing to give them up if they get in the way of loving Him." We must always put God first, & everything else will fall into place. As we contemplate our Lady holding her crucified Son, let us ask her for the grace to "let go and let God." It doesn't matter what we are grasping right now – things, people, or circumstances, we can continuously surrender to God, & He will hear us & come to our rescue. During this month of December, as the year winds down & we prepare for Christmas & a new year, let us practice loving & living with open hands & open hearts, trusting in God when life is great AND when we don't understand or are tempted to despair.
