"Where Eve grasped and lost, Mary surrendered and received; where Eve said no to the alluring mystery, Mary said yes." ~ Bishop Robert Barron

As I thought about the Annunciation, the following came to my mind. In her book "Hind's Feet on High Places," Hannah Hurnard tells the story of a girl named Much-Afraid and her journey to the High Places. At one point on the journey, she looks into her heart and sees a flower growing there which says to her, "Behold me, here I am, growing in your heart, 'Acceptance-with-Joy.'" Then, Much-Afraid builds an altar, as she does many times throughout the book as an act of surrender. She wonders what she should place on the altar this time. Then, she places her heart on the altar and says, "Behold me, here I am; thy little handmaiden Acceptance-with-Joy and all that is in my heart is thine." These words sound very similar to Mary's reply to the angel Gabriel: "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. Let it be done unto me according to thy word."

Our Lady said yes even though she didn't know all the details of what the future held. She said yes despite knowing that it would be hard at times. She surrendered her life, her heart, and her will to the will of God. So, during this month of February, a month of hearts and love, let us say "yes" with Mary and surrender our hearts to our Heavenly Father. The gift of our love and complete surrender to His will is the greatest gift we can give Him. I leave you with the words of a song by the Brooklyn Tabernacle Choir: "What can I give Him, / Poor as I am? / If I were a shepherd, / I would bring Him a Lamb. / If I were a wise man, / I'd sure do my part. / So, what can I give Him? / I'll give Him my heart. / [...] What can you give Him? / What can you bring? What can you offer / That's fit for a King? / Bow before Jesus. / That's where you can start. / What can you give Him? / Just give Him your heart."



Bishop Paul, J. Bradley Apostolic Administrator Diocese of Steubenville

Bishop Paul Bradley was born in McKeesport, Pennsylvania in 1945, one of eight children. He attended St. Meinrad Seminary in St. Meinrad, Indiana and was ordained to the priesthood, in 1971 for the Diocese of Pittsburgh. He served as parochial vicar in several parishes of the diocese while earning a master's degree in social work from the Uni-

versity of Pitsburgh. His other assignments included important positions with youth, family life, and human services. He was appointed pastor of St Sebastian Parish in 1994 and later rector and pastor of the St. Paul Cathedral parish. In 2003 he was chosen to be general secretary and vicar general of the Diocese. Bishop Bradley was appointed auxiliary Bishop of Pittsburgh, in 2004 and served as apostolic admin-istrator of the Diocese until the installation of Bishop Zubik. From 2009 to 2023, he served as the Bishop of Kalamazoo, Michigan. He interrupted his retirement upon accepting the position of apostolic administrator of the Diocese of Steubenville in September 2023. Having worked with family life, he fought for traditional marriage. At his Ordination, Bishop Bradley selected as his Episcopal

motto "Waiting in Joyful Hope. As Bishop, he faithfully served the dioceses of Pittsburgh, Kalamazoo, and currently Steubenville



Dr. Alan Schreck Professor of Theology Franciscan University

Our main speaker has been a profes sor of theology for over 45 years at the Franciscan University of Steubenville. Dr. Schreck has spoken A numerous conferences for laity and academicians in Steubenville and all over the country. Outside of class he belongs to the Community of God's Love, a Catholic charismatic community, a member of Tri-

umph of the Cross Church, a runner who has coached track for youth and Catholic schools, and an Eagle scout who many years as assistant Scoutmaster of Troop 401. Despite being so busy, he and his wife Nancy raised five children and have 16 grandchildren - and counting. The men who attend the Men's Conference will receive some

fascinating insights about how to live in the power of the Holy Spirit, beyond what we learned as boys and young men in catechism and preparation for the sacrament of Confirmation catechism and preparation for the sacrament of Continuation often many years ago. Dr. Schreck will explore such points as: Who is the Holy Spirit?; What is His role in the Church?; How can the Holy Spirit be a most valuable resource and help us in our daily lives?; How and when do we pray to Him? My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Responding to the Holy Father's invitation to the entire Universal Church, all clergy, religious and lay faithful in the Diocese of Steubenville are invited to participate in one of four reflection and discussion sessions designed to deepen our understanding of what it means to be a "Synodal Church in Mission" here in the 13 counties of southeastern Ohio that form our diocese. These 90-minute sessions will be held in four different parishes on the afternoon of Sunday, Feb. 18, at Holy Rosary Church, Steubenville; St. Benedict Church, Cambridge; the Basilica of St. Mary of the Assumption, Marietta; and St. Joseph Church, Ironton. The theme of these sessions is "A Synodal Church in Mission: Discerning God's Plan for the Future." These discussions are important not only for the Universal Church and her future, but for our own local church in these 13 counties, as well.

Synodality invites us to pray attentively, to listen to the Word of God faithfully with open minds and hearts, and to engage in respectful and productive dialogue with one another. If we truly want to be faithful missionary disciples of Our Lord Jesus Christ, we will use this opportunity to grow as individuals, families and parish communities in our ability to proclaim the gospel of joy to all God's people – those who are close to us and those who are strangers.

These synodal sessions will also provide those who participate an opportunity to identify their experience of the vitality of the church here in our diocese, and what we can do to revitalize our faith through outreach to those who have fallen away from the practice of the faith and/or to those who practice no faith.

Let us entrust these reflection and discussion sessions to the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary, our diocesan patroness. Through her intercession, may we come to a fuller understanding of what it means to listen prayerfully to God's Word and to respond freely and generously as Mary did.
