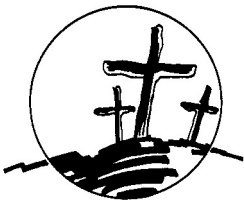

## **Christ the Teacher Diocesan Scholarship Fund – “Turning Taxes into Tuition”**

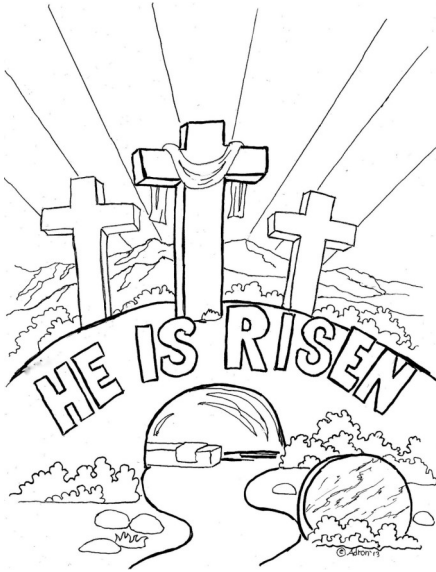
### **Women's Evening of Recollection on Wednesday, April 10.**

### **The Sorrow of the Dogwood**

### **The Robin**

*[...] The Romans crucified their criminals on the hill called Calvary, just outside the old city of Jerusalem. They made Jesus carry up this road the very cross to which he would be nailed. As it is told by some who were there, a little robin saw that a thorn from Jesus' crown had pierced his forehead, and he was bleeding. The tiny bird flew down and plucked out the thorn. But as he did, a drop of Jesus' blood fell upon the bird's breast, staining it red. From that time to this, it is said, robins have had red breasts as a reminder that one of them was kind to Jesus that sad day.*



### **The Easter Lily**

*One of the most famous biblical references to the lily is the Sermon on the Mount, when Christ told his listeners: "Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they toil not, neither do they spin; and yet Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these."*

*[Tradition has it that when Eve left the Garden of Eden she shed real tears of repentance, and from those remorseful tears sprang up lilies.]*

*Often called the "white-robed apostles of hope," lilies are said to have been found growing in the garden of Gethsemane after Christ's agony. Tradition says that the beautiful white lilies sprang up where drops of Christ's sweat fell to the ground in His final hours of sorrow and distress. Christian churches continue this tradition at Easter by filling their altars and surrounding their crosses with masses of Easter lilies to commemorate the Resurrection and hope of life everlasting.*
